Fiscal Year 2023 Appropriations Bill At-A-Glance



Provides **\$64.57 billion, a 15 percent increase**, to strengthen our alliances, support vulnerable people, bolster public health infrastructure, confront climate change, advance women's rights, and promote democracy

Strengthens our Alliances

- Provides a total of \$9 billion for international security assistance to support allies, international narcotics control and law enforcement activities, antiterrorism programs, and peacekeeping operations
- Includes \$4.67 billion in assistance through international organizations and banks to work with partners to address global challenges
- Reaffirms U.S. leadership on the world's stage by funding our United Nations (UN) assessments and increasing our contributions to key UN agencies and other international organizations

Supports Displaced and Vulnerable People

- Help the world's most vulnerable meet urgent needs, many of which have been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic and the global rise of food and fuel prices, with \$8.095 billion in humanitarian assistance

Bolsters Public Health Infrastructure

- Strengthens the global public health infrastructure to continue combating the COVID-19 pandemic, prevent future pandemics, and shore up gains made in global health with \$11 billion to support the health of families and communities around the world
- Includes \$1 billion for global health security and \$2 billion for the new replenishment of the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis, and Malaria

Confronts Climate Change

- Expands efforts to address environmental threats and reduce emissions with \$3.6 billion to fight climate change abroad, including \$1.6 billion for the Green Climate Fund

Advances Women's Rights

- Supports women and girls with \$760 million for bilateral family planning and \$70 million for the United Nations Population Fund and prioritizes equality and women's empowerment
- Removes the Helms amendment restrictions that prohibit safe abortion and health care for vulnerable women and repeals the Global Gag Rule on non-governmental organizations

Promotes Democracy

- Promotes democracy, human rights, and anti-corruption efforts, including with \$2.8 billion for democracy programs
- Provides over \$1.7 billion to promote a free and open Indo-Pacific and help counter the growing influence of the government of the People's Republic of China
