## **Instructions for Tribal Public Witnesses**

January 28, 2022

Dear Tribal Leader,

As the Committee on Appropriations, Subcommittee on Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies of the House of Representatives begins preparation for the fiscal year 2023 annual appropriations bill, we want to hear from Indian Country on issues and needs related to the Department of the Interior, the Indian Health Service, and other agencies. These hearings are extremely productive. Unfortunately, due to the ongoing pandemic, the large number of witnesses, and the difficulty associated with holding a virtual hearing trying to ensure everyone has sufficient time to provide their testimony, the subcommittee must once again solicit written testimony from Tribes and Tribal organizations. We will, however, hold two virtual hearings with invited national and regional Tribal organizations in March to hear about broader appropriations needs.

The testimony received in prior years, especially when it is focused on more discrete topics, has been extremely informative and is used to develop the annual appropriation bill. Because of this, the subcommittee is requesting written testimony on the issues and needs of Indian Country. Please be assured that this testimony will be distributed to subcommittee members and their staff, and will be published with the subcommittee's hearing records at www.govinfo.gov. As always, the testimony will be read and considered by the subcommittee as the appropriations process goes forward for fiscal year 2023. We hope to resume in person hearings in 2023 when development of the fiscal year 2024 bill commences.

In the meantime, written testimony for fiscal year 2023 may include information on any or all areas within the subcommittee's jurisdiction. Testimony is limited to 4 pages and must be received no later than March 10, 2022. For your testimony to be considered by the subcommittee, you must also submit a Witness Disclosure Form. <a href="https://appropriations.house.gov/sites/democrats.appropriations.house.gov/files/Truth%20in%20Testimony%20Form.pdf">https://appropriations.house.gov/sites/democrats.appropriations.house.gov/files/Truth%20in%20Testimony%20Form.pdf</a> Rule XI, clause 2 (g)(5), of the U.S. House of Representatives provides: (B) In the case of a witness appearing in a nongovernmental capacity, a written statement of proposed testimony shall include a curriculum vitae and a disclosure of any Federal grants or contracts, or contracts or payments originating with a foreign government, received during the calendar year or either of the two previous calendar years by the witness or by any entity represented by the witness and related to the subject matter of the hearing. ☐ All document files will be accepted, but PDF documents are preferred.
