THE 2021 TRUMP BUDGET HURTS RURAL COMMUNITIES

President Trump's fiscal year 2021 budget proposes massive cuts and outright eliminations of discretionary programs that enhance public health, expand broadband, and spur economic development in rural communities.

Reduces Rural Broadband

Reduces the Department of Agriculture's (USDA) rural broadband programs by \$325 million, or approximately 50 percent, making it harder for rural communities to connect to the 21st century economy.

Slashes Rural Housing Programs

Zeroes out USDA funding for direct low-income purchase loans and home ownership repair programs that help rural Americans purchase and remain in their homes.

Attacks Public Health Protections

Proposes a \$130 million reduction, or 9 percent, to loan programs that ensure safe drinking water and sanitary waste disposal in rural communities.

Hurts Rural Economic Development

Eliminates funding for rural communities that spur regional economic growth through job training and business development.

Reduces Funding for Rural Health Care

Cuts Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) health care programs in rural communities by \$71 million, including the complete elimination of grant funding for rural hospital improvements.
