TACKLES HUNGER

- Expands access to fresh fruits and vegetables to 6.2 million people through the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC)
- Ensures 42 million people in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)-eligible families get the benefits they need with \$140.4 billion for SNAP
- Invests in the health of America's kids through Child Nutrition programs, like school meals, including the Summer Food Service Program and the Summer EBT program

LIFTS UP RURAL COMMUNITIES

- Provides \$450 million for the ReConnect rural broadband program, which last year got more than 100,000 people connected to the 21st century economy
- Includes \$1.45 billion for rural water and waste program loans and more than \$653 million for grants for clean and reliable drinking water systems and sanitary waste disposal systems
- Provides \$30 billion in loan authority for guaranteed single family housing loans; \$1.25 billion in direct single family housing loans; and \$1.495 billion for rental assistance for low-income families and the elderly in rural communities

REBUILDS HEALTH AND SAFETY INFRASTRUCTURE

- Strengthens the health and safety of American families with \$3.3 billion in discretionary funding for the Food and Drug Administration (FDA)
- Includes increased funding to address maternal and infant nutrition, emerging food-related chemical and toxicological issues, drug safety oversight, and provides additional resources for overseas drug inspections, and drug and device supply chain monitoring and surveillance
- Modernizes FDA's data infrastructure to better ensure the safety and security of the food and medical supply chain

CONFRONTS THE CLIMATE CRISIS

• Provides \$78.3 million across the Department of Agriculture (USDA) to address the impacts of climate change through investments in sustainable agriculture, research, and clean energy

SUPPORTS EQUALITY FOR COMMUNITIES OF COLOR

- Ensures equitable participation in USDA programs, including funding for 1890s land grants, 1994 land grants, and Hispanic serving institutions to help strengthen the pipeline for the future of agriculture
- Substantially increases funding to help resolve ownership and succession of farmland issues, often referred to as heirs property
