

The bill provides \$46.4 billion to spur energy innovation, boost economic prosperity, improve water infrastructure, & mitigate & adapt to climate change

U.S. Department of Energy: \$37.1 billion

- Energy Efficiency & Renewable Energy (EERE) \$2.65 billion for clean, affordable & secure energy, & ensures American leadership in the transition to a global clean energy economy
 - The bill provides \$2.3 billion above the President's budget request for EERE & \$272 million above the fiscal year 2019 enacted level



 Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy (ARPA-E) — \$425 million in funding to support research aimed at rapidly developing energy technologies that are capable of significantly changing the energy sector to address our critical economic, environmental, & energy security challenges

The bill rejects the President's proposed elimination of ARPA-E



• Electric Grid Research & Development — \$350 million for efforts to secure the nation's energy infrastructure against hazards, reduce the risks of & impacts from cybersecurity events, & modernize the nation's electric grid



 National Nuclear Security Administration — \$15.9 billion to ensure a safe, secure, & credible nuclear deterrent while addressing the threat of nuclear proliferation and terrorism



 Environmental Management — \$7.2 billion for environmental cleanup, including nuclear waste cleanup at 16 sites across the country

Army Corps of Engineers: \$7.36 billion



 Provides \$2.53 billion above the President's budget request (& an increase of \$357) million above the fiscal year 2019 enacted level) for programs & projects including studies, construction, operation, & maintenance

• The bill provides for six new study starts & six new construction projects

U.S. Bureau of Reclamation: \$1.63 billion



 Provides \$528 million above the budget request (& an increase of \$83 million) above the fiscal year 2019 enacted level) for water resource management & other water resources projects, including those authorized in the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN) Act
