IN THE FISCAL YEAR 2020 HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS BILLS

Transportation-Housing & Urban Development \$61 BILLION FOR INFRASTRUCTURE FROM DEDICATED TRUST FUNDS

- Department of Transportation's National Infrastructure Investments (TIGER/BUILD) \$1 billion, \$100 million above the 2019 enacted level & equal to the President's budget request
- Federal Highway Administration's Highway Infrastructure Programs \$1.75 billion, \$1.45 billion above the President's budget request
- Federal Transit Administration's Transit Infrastructure Grants \$750 million, \$50 million above the 2019 enacted level & \$250 million above the President's budget request
- Federal Aviation Administration's Airport Improvement Grants \$500 million, equal to the 2019 enacted level & \$500 million above the President's budget request
- Federal Railroad Administration's Consolidated Rail Infrastructure & Safety Improvements \$350 million, \$95 million above 2019 enacted level & \$20 million above the President's budget
- Maritime Administration's Port Infrastructure Development Program \$225 million [†]
- Ensures the Administration deploys transportation investments:
 - Ties salaries for and number of political appointees at DOT to executing prior year infrastructure investments
 - Allows Capital Investment Grants project sponsors access to funds if the Administration doesn't award them in a timely manner

Energy & Water Development

- \$400 million in additional funding for water resources projects under the Bureau of Reclamation, including those authorized in the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN) Act.
- Department of Energy's Cybersecurity, Energy Security, and Emergency Response \$150 million, \$30 million above the fiscal year 2019 level
 - This funding will secure the nation's energy infrastructure against all hazards, reduce the risks of and impacts from cybersecurity events, and assist with restoration activities.
- Appalachian Regional Commission \$170 million, \$5 million above the fiscal year 2019 level & the President's budget request

Commerce-Justice-Science

- Department of Commerce's Economic Development Administration \$540 million, an increase of \$236 million above the fiscal year 2019 level.
 - These funds will help improve our nation's infrastructure, boost economically recovering communities, and launch innovative community development efforts.

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Agriculture-Rural Development-FDA

Rural Development Programs — \$3.943 billion

• These programs help create an environment for economic growth by providing business and housing opportunities and building sustainable rural infrastructure for the modern economy

Expansion of Broadband Service — \$680 million

- To provide economic development opportunities and improved education and healthcare services. These significant investments reflect a commitment to enabling Americans in rural communities to access digital tools necessary to improve health, educational, & economic outcomes
- The bill provides \$996.6 million to help farmers, ranchers, and other private landowners conserve & protect their land
 - This includes \$167 million for infrastructure for watershed and flood prevention and watershed rehabilitation projects

Interior-Environment

Clean Water State Revolving Fund — \$1.8 billion

- Requires at least 10% of funds to be used for green infrastructure or energy efficiency projects, reserves \$2 million for technical assistance & training grants, & requires that 10% of grant funds be used for additional subsidization.
- Drinking Water State Revolving Fund \$1.3 billion
 - Allows funds to be used to finance green infrastructure or energy efficiency projects, and requires that 14% be used for additional subsidization.
- Indian Health Service health facilities construction \$964 million, \$85 million above the 2019 enacted level and \$161 million above the President's budget request
 - This includes an additional \$60 million for replacement facilities, including \$20 million for small health clinics, \$20 million for staff quarters, and \$10 million to invest in green infrastructure
- Critical Infrastructure Protection \$9.1 million, recognizing importance of efforts to harden critical water infrastructure against threats by both malevolent actors and natural hazards
- National Park Service \$4 million for replacement of Global Positioning System (GPS) data collection devices used by the Service for facilities planning, lands administration, visitor safety, & infrastructure protection
- Encourages Environmental Protection Agencty to include adequate funding for advancing full scale applied research & testing capabilities to address threats to drinking water & drinking water infrastructure

Labor-Health & Human Services-Education

- Centers for Disease Control \$225 million in transfers from the HHS Nonrecurring Expenses Fund for a new research support building & campus infrastructure improvements
- \$20 million for the interconnection system and system wide infrastructure for the Corporation for Public Broadcasting (CPB), the same as the 2019 enacted level
