Fiscal Year 2023 Appropriations Bill At-A-Glance



Provides **\$27.6** billion, a **\$1.7** billion increase, to grow opportunity for small businesses and consumers, secure our democracy, combat crime, and support DC families and federal workers

Grows Opportunity for Small Businesses and Entrepreneurs

- Helps small businesses and entrepreneurs access capital and contracting opportunities with \$1.2 billion for the Small Business Administration, including \$320 million for Entrepreneurial Development Programs
- Promotes economic development with \$324 million for Community Development Financial Institutions

Protects Consumers

- Protects working and middle-class consumers with \$152.5 million for the Consumer Product Safety Commission
- Uproots anticompetitive, deceptive, and unfair business practices with \$430 million for antitrust, privacy, and cybersecurity work at the Federal Trade Commission
- Supports investors with \$2.2 billion for financial protection activities at the Securities and Exchange Commission

Combats Crime and Corruption

- Protects our communities from drug trafficking and its consequences with \$302 million for the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Areas Program and \$109 million for the Drug-Free Communities Program
- Combats crime and corruption with \$190 million to combat money laundering through the Financial Crimes Enforcement Network
- Fights terrorist financing and enhances economic sanctions enforcement for human rights, corruption, and other sanctions programs with over \$216 million for Terrorism and Financial Intelligence

Secures our Democracy and Elections

- Ensures the integrity and safety of our elections with \$75 million for Election Security Grants to help states secure election systems and improve election administration
- Strengthens our Judicial system with \$8.5 billion to support court operations and increased security and protective services in courthouses

Supports Federal Workers

• Supports the Administration's 4.6 percent pay increase for Federal workers

Supports District of Columbia Families

- Helps students and families with the cost of education with \$40 million for D.C. Resident Tuition support which makes up the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition to ensure D.C. residents have options in higher education
- Funds critical water and sewer infrastructure improvements with \$8 million
- Provides \$4 million to combat HIV/AIDS in D.C.
