Chairwoman Barbara Lee Fiscal Year 2023 Appropriations Bill At-A-Glance



The bill provides **\$59.7 billion, a \$3.6 billion increase**, to strengthen our alliances, promote democracy, support vulnerable people, bolster public health infrastructure, and improve our diplomatic capabilities. In addition, the legislation **includes \$16.6 billion in emergency humanitarian, economic, and security assistance** for Ukraine, countries affected by the situation in Ukraine, and other assistance to vulnerable populations and communities.

Strengthens our Alliances

- Provides a total of \$8.9 billion for international security assistance to support allies, international narcotics control and law enforcement activities, antiterrorism and nonproliferation programs, and peacekeeping operations
- Includes \$2.8 billion in multilateral assistance through international organizations and banks to work with partners to address global challenges
- Reaffirms U.S. leadership on the world's stage by funding our United Nations (UN) assessments and increasing our contributions to key UN agencies and other international organizations

Promotes Democracy

- Pushes back against the rise of authoritarianism by investing \$2.9 billion for democracy programs globally and \$315 million for the National Endowment for Democracy
- Provides over \$1.8 billion to promote a free and open Indo-Pacific and help counter the growing influence of the government of the People's Republic of China

Supports Displaced and Vulnerable People

• Addresses the historic levels of global displacement and humanitarian caused by natural disasters, economic strain from the pandemic, and the worldwide impact of Russia's aggression in Ukraine with \$6.8 billion in humanitarian assistance and \$2.5 billion in emergency humanitarian funding

Bolsters Public Health Infrastructure

- Strengthens the global public health infrastructure to continue combating the COVID-19 pandemic, prevent future pandemics, and shore up gains made in global health with \$10.56 billion to support the health of families and communities around the world
- Includes \$900 million for global health security and \$2 billion for the new replenishment of the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis, and Malaria

Improves Our Diplomatic Capabilities

- Supports the operation of our diplomatic presence overseas in over 275 diplomatic posts with \$9.5 billion for the Department of State's Diplomatic Programs and \$1.7 billion for USAID's Operating Expenses
- Fosters greater diversity among our diplomatic and development workforce by supporting diversity and inclusions strategies at foreign affairs agencies including \$18 million to support paid internships
