CREATES GOOD-PAYING JOBS AND REBUILDS CRUMBLING INFRASTRUCTURE

- Unlocks a historic amount of funding in the bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act to fix roads and highways, expand bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure, support Federal auto safety programs, and invest in transit
- Rebuilds our crumbling infrastructure with \$102.9 billion in budgetary resources for the Department of Transportation to invest in airports, highways, transit, passenger rail, and port systems
- Advances the safety and reliability of our rail systems and ports by providing \$3.3 billion for the Federal Railroad Administration and \$234 million for the Port Infrastructure Development Program
- Provides \$30 million for a newly created Thriving Communities Program for DOT and HUD
 to provide technical assistance, planning, and capacity building to rural and urban
 underserved communities in need of improved transportation systems and to address
 historical inequities

GROWS OPPORTUNITY THROUGH AFFORDABLE HOUSING

- Expands Housing Choice Vouchers by up to 25,000 low-income individuals and families experiencing or at risk of homelessness, including survivors of domestic violence and veterans; includes up to 4,000 new affordable housing units for seniors and persons with disabilities; and protects housing assistance for more than 4.8 million individuals and families
- Includes \$11 billion in funding to construct new and repair old affordable housing and improve critical health, safety, and maintenance of public and low-income housing
- Provides \$1.5 billion for states and local governments through the HOME Investment Partnerships Program, and significantly increases investments in distressed neighborhoods through the Choice Neighborhoods Initiative program

PROMOTES SAFETY

- Promotes safe transportation and housing with a skilled and growing workforce to conduct inspections, mitigate hazards, and study emerging threats and innovative solutions to protect people and wildlife
- Includes \$415 million for the Office of Lead Hazard Control and Healthy Homes to improve living conditions and health of low-income families by investing in lead paint mitigation and radon testing, including \$25 million to conduct lead inspections in housing choice voucher units
- Provides \$3.2 billion to address critical routine maintenance and repairs in nearly 1 million public housing units in order to improve the living conditions and preserve housing for nearly 2 million low-income residents.
