FY 2023 HOMELAND SECURITY APPROPRIATIONS

Dear Colleague:

As the Chairwoman of the Appropriations Subcommittee on Homeland Security, I am writing to convey the <u>guidelines</u> for consideration of member requests for the fiscal year 2023 appropriations cycle.

Member requests can only be considered if submitted through the Committee's <u>electronic database</u>. Please select the appropriate component, funding account, and type of request from the database's drop-down menus. Bill language requests should be submitted as "General Provisions" requests.

Programmatic and Language Requests

The requirements remain unchanged from prior years and are detailed in the Subcommittee guidance document.

Community Project Funding

The Subcommittee on Homeland Security will accept Community Project Funding requests for only the following Federal Emergency Management Agency—Federal Assistance accounts:

- Pre-Disaster Mitigation grants; and
- Emergency Operations Center grants.

The Subcommittee will not accept project requests for any other accounts.

Project funding for fiscal year 2022 ranged between \$36,000 and \$3,000,000 for Emergency Operations Center grants and between \$150,000 and \$9,950,000 for Pre-Disaster Mitigation grants. We do not expect to fund projects for fiscal year 2023 that exceed the maximum amounts for fiscal year 2022. In addition, while we will otherwise try to provide the full federal cost share for funded CPFs, overall demand may limit our

ability to do so. Members are encouraged to make clear the minimum amount of federal funding for a project required in order for it to move forward.

After reviewing the <u>guidance</u> document, please contact the <u>Subcommittee staff</u> with any questions about submitting member requests. For technical questions related to the request database, contact the <u>Committee IT shop</u>.

The deadline for submitting program, language, and Community Project Funding requests to the Subcommittee will be at 6:00 p.m. on April 28, 2022.
