



ENERGY & WATER FUNDING BILL RAISES COSTS, HARMS ENERGY RELIABILITY AND SECURITY

STATE-BY-STATE IMPACTS OF REPUBLICAN CUTS

House Republicans' 2027 Energy and Water Development funding bill cuts Department of Energy (DOE) non-defense spending by over \$1.2 billion compared to 2026 enacted levels. The bill further cuts Environmental and Other Defense Activities accounts – defense spending outside of the National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA) – by over \$800 million. **These cuts hit every single state – red, blue, rural, and urban – harming Americans' access to affordable, reliable, and secure energy and undermining programs to clean up radioactive waste from early atomic energy programs.**

Cuts Due to the Republican Elimination of the Army Corps of Engineers' Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program

House Republicans' 2027 Energy and Water Development bill also eliminates the Corps of Engineers' Formerly Utilized Sites Remedial Action Program (FUSRAP), which is responsible for cleaning up sites with contamination resulting from the nation's early atomic energy program. President Trump's 2027 Budget Request included the projects under FUSRAP listed below. The projects will not receive funding under House Republicans' funding bill, impacting red and blue districts across the country.
