FISCAL YEAR 2027 FACT SHEET

The middle class, the working class, and the vulnerable are facing a cost-of-living crisis. They need affordable health care, access to reproductive health care, high quality public education, and job training. Republicans are abandoning them. House Republicans are leaving working families out to dry by attacking education at all levels, decimating access to job training, cutting funding for the ACA health insurance marketplace and reproductive health care, and abandoning ongoing health crises. With a 9 percent cut below 2026, Republicans' funding bill kicks 30,000 teachers out of classrooms, harms women and children, and leaves Americans on their own to cope with inflation and the rising cost of living. While Democrats help families make ends meet, keep people safe, and invest in our children, Republicans aim to eliminate services that keep families afloat. The Republican bill:

Jeopardizes Health Care Coverage for Millions, Attacks Women's Health

- Cancels \$2 billion for operating Affordable Care Act (ACA) health insurance plans, which would threaten the ACA health insurance Marketplace and put health care coverage for millions of Americans in jeopardy.
- Blocks funding for Planned Parenthood health centers and access to abortion and reproductive health services.
- Eliminates funding for Title X Family Planning, Healthy Start, and the Teen Pregnancy Prevention Program.

Abandons College Students and Hardworking Americans

- Increases interest rates for 5 million college student borrowers and slashes funding for need-based financial aid—making it harder for students to pay for a college education.
- Leaves behind working people by eliminating funding for WIOA Adult Job Training, Youth Job Training, and cutting funding for the Job Corps program by 50 percent.
- Fails to protect workers' wages, health, and safety by slashing worker protection agencies.

Furtheres Republicans' Goal of Eliminating Public Education

- Decimates support for children in K-12 elementary schools by slashing Department of Education resources by \$8 billion, 10 percent, below 2026, including cutting Title I Grants to Local Educational Agencies by nearly \$2 billion.
- Eliminates funding for teacher training opportunities, a cut of more than \$2 billion below 2026, as school districts work to improve literacy rates nationwide.
- Eliminates funding for community schools and English Language Acquisition programs.

Surrenders to Ongoing Health Crises

- Cuts funding for HIV/AIDS prevention and treatment at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Ryan White HIV/AIDS program.
- Eliminates funding for Firearm Injury and Mortality Prevention Research.
- Cuts funding for substance use prevention and treatment services, as well as mental health services.
