Fiscal Year 2020 Bill At-a-Glance



The bill provides \$690 billion in discretionary funds to defend against evolving threats, prepare for future challenges, & meet needs of service members & families

Military Personnel: \$153.9 billion



- Funds active duty end strength of 1,337,500 & reserve component end strength of 800,800
- Provides full funding necessary to support the proposed 3.1 percent military pay raise
- •\$297 million for Department & Services' Sexual Assault Prevention & Response programs

Operations & Maintenance: \$256 billion



- \$1.05 billion for key readiness programs to prepare forces for combat operations & other peacetime missions, equipment, aviation, & ship depot maintenance, training, & base operations
- \$20 billion for depot maintenance
- \$1.26 billion for Environmental Restoration activities
- \$70.7 million for upgrades to childcare facilities

Other Department of Defense Programs: \$33 billion



- Defense Health Programs \$33.46 billion plus \$347.7 million for OCO/GWOT requirements
- Drug Interdiction & Counter-Drug Activities \$970 million including \$153 million for OCO/GWOT
- Public Schools on Military Installations \$270 million

Congressional Oversight



- Rejects the President's \$98 billion OCO gimmick, restoring funds to base accounts
- Prohibits the use of Defense funds for the President's border wall at our troops' expense
- Responds to the Department of Defense's abuse of congressionally granted reprogramming privileges by reducing transfer authority from the \$9.5 billion requested to \$1.5 billion, & reducing thresholds for prior approval reprogrammings
- Prohibits the transfer of F-35 fighters to Turkey to prevent the exposure of cutting-edge U.S. technology to Russian missile systems
