FISCAL YEAR 2020 APPROPRIATIONS AGREEMENT



Protecting Our Democracy

- Election Security Grants to States – \$425 million, a key priority that was not funded in FY19

Preventing Gun Violence

- For the first time in more than 20 years, a total of \$25 million at CDC & NIH for firearm injury & mortality prevention research

Ensuring a Fair & Accurate 2020 Census

- Census Bureau – \$7.6 billion, \$3.7 billion above FY19 & \$1.4 billion above President's request

Supporting Children & Families

- Child Care & Development Block Grant – \$5.8 billion, \$550 million over FY19 & a record level
- Head Start – \$10.6 billion, \$550 million over FY19 & a record level

Investing in Better Schools & Job Training

- Education for the Disadvantaged – \$17 billion, \$453 million above FY19 & a record level
- Job Training – \$5.4 billion, a \$134 million increase

Bolstering Lifesaving Medical Research

- NIH – \$41.7 billion, a \$2.6 billion increase and a record level, with significant funding for Alzheimer's Disease & brain research

Combating the Opioid Crisis

- State Opioid Response Grants – \$1.5 billion, continuing the historic investment initiated in FY18

Expanding Access to Housing

- Community Development Block Grants – \$3.4 billion, a \$100 million increase above FY19
- HOME Program – \$1.35 billion, a \$100 million increase above FY19

Protecting Our Environment

- EPA – \$9 billion, a \$208 million increase above FY19
- Energy Efficiency & Renewables – \$2.8 billion, a \$411 million (17%) increase above FY19
- Land & Water Conservation Fund – \$495 million, \$57 million above FY19 & highest level since 2004

Invests in Science

- Science Programs – Increases of \$415 million for Department of Energy Office of Science, \$233.2 million for NASA Science, and \$203.3 million for the National Science Foundation

Increases Federal Civilian Pay

- Provides a 3.1% pay raise for federal civilian employees for calendar year 2020
