



ISRAEL SECURITY SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS ACT, 2024

Title I – Department of Defense

Defensive Activities – \$13 billion to aid in the defense of Israel and to support our military personnel deployed to the region, including \$4.4 billion to replenish U.S. stocks of equipment sent to Israel through Presidential drawdown authority, \$2.4 billion for Central Command operations and related activities, and \$5.2 billion for Iron Dome, David’s Sling, and Iron Beam defense systems.

Title II – Department of Homeland Security

Nonprofit Security Grants Program – \$400 million for the Nonprofit Security Grant Program at the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA.)

Title III – Department of State and Related Agency

Humanitarian Assistance – \$9.15 billion to address the dire need for humanitarian assistance for Gaza as well as other vulnerable populations around the world.

Security Assistance – \$3.6 billion in security assistance to Israel and partners in the Middle East.

State Department and USAID Operations – \$150 million for the State Department to respond to the situation in Israel and an additional \$7 million for the Inspectors General of the State Department and USAID to conduct oversight of activities related to the Israel-Gaza conflict.

Title IV – General Provisions

Department of Defense Reporting Requirements – The Secretary of Defense shall provide to various Congressional Committees a detailed plan to describe how the resources provided will be used to address U.S. operations, force protection, deterrence, and the replacement of combat expenditures in the United States Central Command region.

State Department Reporting Requirements – Requires a certification by the Secretary of State on the policies and procedures in place to prevent diversion, misuse, or destruction of assistance and requires the Secretary of State and USAID Administrator to inform Congress of any such instances. Also requires a detailed plan to describe how the resources provided will be used.

This title also includes technical budgetary provisions.
