STATE-BY-STATE IMPACTS OF REPUBLICAN FUNDING BILL ON STATE REVOLVING FUNDS

House Republican 2026 Interior, Environment Funding Bill Slashes Resources to Help States Provide Clean, Safe Water

In the richest country in the world, people in every state should have access to clean water. Instead, House Republicans are decimating efforts to ensure our water is safe to drink or use to cook or bathe. Their 2026 Interior, Environment, and Related Agencies bill cuts funding to the states through the Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Funds by \$1.7 billion.

Drinking Water State Revolving Fund

House Republicans are cutting the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund by 65 percent for each state and territory and 11 percent for tribes.

Clean Water State Revolving Fund

House Republicans are cutting the Clean Water State Revolving Fund by 61 percent for each state and territory and 8 percent for tribes.
