FISCAL YEAR 2027 FACT SHEET

House Republicans are failing to rein in out-of-control Department of Homeland Security (DHS) agencies. They are making Americans less safe while completely ignoring the fact that parts of DHS remain shut down because of Republican chaos. The 2027 Homeland Security bill fails to prevent waste, fraud, and abuse of the blank check Republicans handed Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and Customs and Border Protection (CBP) last year. It does nothing to require substantial reforms that Americans have been demanding following the killing of two American citizens. Additionally, this bill fails to sufficiently safeguard the massive, taxpayer-funded expansion of private detention facilities created by Republican policies. **Democrats will not provide funding to lawless agencies without the significant protections the American people are demanding.**

Fails to Include Substantial Reforms

- Despite giving billions of dollars to DHS for immigration enforcement last year, the bill lacks the necessary reforms in the wake of the killing of two American citizens by DHS agents, including mandating the use of body worn cameras in immigration enforcement operations, requiring arrest warrants, and prohibiting immigration enforcement at sensitive locations including hospitals, houses of worship, and schools.
- Fails to provide adequate oversight funding to safeguard the taxpayer money used for the massive expansion of detention facilities and eliminates carveouts in the Office of Inspector General for detention facility oversight.
- Does nothing to address Secretary Mullin's threat to remove CBP officers from airports in Democrat-run cities, which would wreak havoc on travel and tourism.

Abandons Constitutional Rights and Accountability

- Weakens the Office of the Inspector General by cutting its resources by more than \$30 million, which will further harm oversight and accountability across the Department.
- Cuts funding for the Office of Civil Rights and Civil Liberties by another \$5 million, marking a reduction of nearly \$38 million since President Trump took office.
- Slashes the Office of the Citizenship and Immigration Services Ombudsman by nearly 90 percent. These cuts would be detrimental as USCIS makes sweeping changes to immigration policies, including for those seeking legal pathways to citizenship and establishes of a new police force funded through fees.

Weakens National Security and Fails to Protect TSA Workers

- Dramatically cuts funding for cybersecurity and infrastructure protection despite an increasing number of sophisticated attacks from foreign adversaries against U.S. businesses, health care systems, utilities, schools, and state and local governments.
- Limits DHS's ability to counter propaganda campaigns from harmful foreign actors seeking to undermine our national security.
- Makes our elections less secure by limiting DHS's ability to help states protect against foreign actors seeking to undermine our democratic processes.
- Reduces funding for the Transportation Security Administration (TSA) by \$347 million and does nothing to stop the Trump Administration from eliminating the collective bargaining rights of TSA employees, who suffered during the Republican government shutdown.
